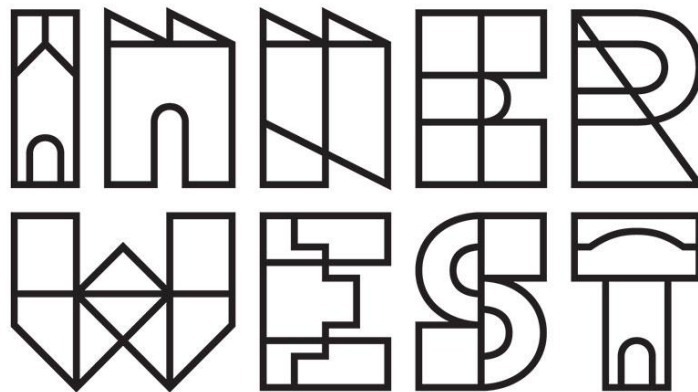

Subject: MAYORAL MINUTE: CONDOLENCE MOTION FOR KRIS CRUDEN

MOTION:

That Council record its sadness at the passing of former Leichhardt Mayor Kris Cruden and write to her partner Mark and daughter Amy to express our solidarity and heartfelt condolences for their loss.

Background

In June the former Mayor of Leichhardt Kris Cruden died.

Kris was elected Mayor of Leichhardt 3 times and is known still today as the “emeritus” Mayor by staff and officials who admired her service.

Her service as a Councillor and Mayor included successful campaigning to protect public foreshore lands, the financial recovery of Leichhardt Council and building collaboration between the community and council officers to improve the Council’s services and engagement.

She was also a long standing official and leader of the Public Service Association of NSW.

Kris was a confidant and ally of the new Prime Minister.

She was a trusted advisor to Ministers and aspirants for high office.

Kris was a leader who inspired great respect in the Labor Party and the Trade Union movement.

Kris was an exemplar of how politics can and should be done.

She was a woman loved throughout our community as person of great integrity.

Subject: MAYORAL MINUTE: ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART CITIZEN TRAINING

MOTION:

That Council:

- 1. Support a civic education program to build awareness of the Uluru Statement from the Heart and the upcoming Referendum on the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament. This is to include the training of 1000 local citizens to assist in civic education about the Referendum within the Inner West and in other communities;**
- 2. Seek the advice and endorsement of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander organisations in the development of the program;**
- 3. Seek the collaboration of the Sydney Alliance and other civic society organisations that have been undertaking similar education already;**
- 4. Make Council's town halls and facilities available for use for this program free of charge;**
- 5. Immediately commence recruitment of local citizens for the civic education program with an initial allocation of \$10 000 to fund the community engagement and outreach needed to get local citizens involved. Funding for this is to be identified in the next quarterly budget review; and**
- 6. Prepare a report for the October Ordinary meeting about the costs and logistics or undertaking the program.**

Background

In February the first act of the newly elected Inner West Council was to incorporate the Uluru Statement from the Heart into Council's Community Strategic Plan.

The Inner West has since successfully initiated and passed motions through both the Local Government NSW Conference and Australian Local Government Association National Congress endorsing the Uluru Statement and calling for those associations to prepare a kit that would allow councils to host civic forums to build awareness of the Uluru Statement and the proposed Referendum on the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament.

In June the Inner West hosted such a forum at Marrickville Town Hall in conjunction with the Minister for Indigenous Australians which was attended by 600 citizens. At that forum I proposed that the Inner West Council initiate a program to train local citizens to assist in civic education about the Uluru Statement and the Referendum.

In July the Prime Minister used a speech at the Garma Festival to put forward the proposed wording for the Referendum question.

Subject: MAYORAL MINUTE: LA FIAMMA PHOTOGRAPHIC COLLECTION

MOTION:

That Council:

- 1. Write to La Fiamma newspaper to thank them for the generous donation of their photographic collection to the Inner Wets Council;**
 - 2. Invite Italo-Australian community organisations including the APIA Club, the Father Atanasio Charitable , The federation of Italian Migrants and their families (FILEF), the Committee of Italians Overseas (ComItEs) and COASIT, to collaborate in the project of cataloguing the collection in order to preserve this unique photographic history; and**
 - 3. Work with the Leichhardt / Annadale Chamber of Commerce and the organisers of Festa to arrange the exhibition of some of the collection in conjunction with the Festa. Council officers are to be made available to coordinate this exhibition.**

Background

In August, the La Fiamma newspaper donated more than 5000 photographs to the Inner West Council from the newspaper's archives. Covering more than 70 years, this collection represents perhaps the most extensive photographic documentation of the history of Italian migrants in Sydney.

Italo-Australian community leaders came together at Leichhardt Town Hall to mark the handover of the collection and indicated their willingness to participate and to involve their members in cataloguing and preserving the collection.

The donation generous but also means the Inner West has a responsibility to properly catalogue, store and display these items.

The upcoming Norton Street Festa, the first Fest to take place since the onset of COVID, provides an opportunity to exhibit some of these photographs publicly.
